What can you expect if your tire blows as you are driving down the road? Your car will pull in the direction of the blowout

## **Emergency Situations**

What actions should you take if you have a blowout?

Grip the wheel firmly

Slow down without braking

Pull on to the shoulder

Change the tire or call someone

#### **Emergency Situations**

What are the steps that you should follow when changing a tire?

Locate jack and spare

Bust lug nuts loose

Jack the car

Remove the tire and replace the tire

Lower the car

Finish tightening the lug nuts

#### **Emergency Situations**

What would you do if your accelerator sticks?

**Brake** 

Turn the engine off

Pull to the shoulder

## **Emergency Situations**

What would you do if your steering failed?

Let foot off of the accelerator

Flashers and horn

**GENTLY** brake

## **Emergency Situations**

What type of fire extinguisher should you carry in your vehicle?

One that works on gas, oil, grease, and electrical fires (type ABC)

# **Emergency Situations**

What would you do if your car stalled on railroad tracks?

Get everyone out of the vehicle if a train is coming

Emergency flashers

Shift to neutral and push the car off the tracks if no train is coming

# **Emergency Situations**

What should you do if your tire slips off the road and onto the shoulder?

Slow down without using the brake

Ease back on to the roadway

## **Emergency Situations**

At what speed can you swerve to a new path in less distance than you need to stop? Above 30 mph

## **Emergency Situations**

What would you do if you were going too fast when you entered a curve? Gently slow down

## **Emergency Situations**

What would you do if another car crossed the centerline and entered your lane? Slow down

Maintain control

Pull to the shoulder if necessary

Flash lights

Honk horn
