Chapter 4 - Managing Risk

- Risk Real and Perceived
 - Possibility of a collision
 - Other Drivers
 - Other Vehicles
 - Roadway/environment
 - Manage risk to lower possibility of a collision
- System Orderly system that promotes good visual habits
 - Aim high in steering
 - Keep your eyes moving
 - Get the big picture
 - Make sure others see you
 - Leave yourself an "out"
- Zone One of six areas of space around a vehicle that is the width of a lane and extends as far as the driver can see.
- Zones
- o Open Zone a space where you can drive without restriction
- o Closed Zone A space not open to you because of a restriction
- The Zone Control System

Check the other zones

Create time and space by getting the best speed control, lane position, and communication

Searching Ranges

Line of sight - the distance you can see ahead in the direction you are looking.

Path of travel - the space your vehicle will occupy.

- Target Area The section of roadway where the target is located in the center of your intended path, and the area to its right and left
- Searching Zones

Target area range - space from your vehicle to the target area (4-6 seconds minimum)

20-30 econd range - distance you will travel in that time

20-30 econd range - distance you will travel in that time

- Orderly Visual Search Pattern
 - o Process of searching critical areas in a regular sequence
 - o What are the critical areas?
- Scanning The art of glancing continually and quickly through your search pattern
- o Field of Vision The area you can see around while looking straight ahead
- o Central vision the area you can see clearly (10 degrees)
- o Peripheral vision left and right of your central vision

Other users - ground viewing

Roadway features and conditions

Traffic controls

- Lane Position 1 Middle of the lane
 - o In what situation that you might use this lane position?
- o Lane Position 2 Hug the left of the lane
 - o In what situation that you might use this lane position?
- Lane Position 3 Hug the right side of the lane
 - o In what situation that you might use this lane position?
- o Communicating How can you communicate with other drivers?
- IPDE Process

Identify - Use a visual search pattern

Predict - Use of knowledge, judgment, and experience

Decide - Make a decision to use one or more actions

Execute - Execute your maneuver based upon your decision

Identify and Predict

A driver must identify hazards by knowing when to look, where to look, how to look, and what to look for.

The sooner a driver can identify a hazard, the more time they will have to react safely.

How to Predict

- Evaluate situation and make a judgment on consequences
- o More complex situations are harder to identify and predict
- Knowledge, judgment, and experience are keys
